Dr Michael Danesh-Meyer BDS MDS (perio)

Dr Danesh-Meyer gained his BDS and MDS (with Distinction) from University of Otago. He subsequently taught at the University and was in full-time

private practice limited to dental implants and periodontics in New Zealand prior to his academic appointment in the USA. From 1998-2000 he was Clinical Assistant Professor in Periodontology and Associate Scientist in the Laboratory for Applied Periodontal and Craniofacial Regeneration at Temple University, School of Dentistry in Philadelphia.

He has been involved in preclinical and clinical research involving GTR/GBR & dental implants since 1991, has authored numerous articles and lectures both nationally and internationally on topics related to tissue regeneration and dental implant therapy. While in the USA he was involved in research using recombinant bone morphogenic proteins (rhBMP-2) for periodontal and alveolar regeneration.

Dr Danesh-Meyer retuned to New Zealand in 2000 and established the Institute of Dental Implants & Periodontics and the Auckland Clinical Training Centre in Newmarket, Auckland. Dr Danesh-Meyer is a Fellow of the International Congress of Oral Implantologists, ITI member, Faculty member for Global Institute for Dental Education/UCLA Masters program in implant dentistry and is actively involved in teaching periodontics and implant dentistry to dentists, postgraduates and specialists.



Dr Richard Eilenberg BDS (Otago) MSc (Lon)

Dr Eilenberg gained his Bachelor of Dental Surgery from Otago in 1981 and was awarded the "Leask Silver Memorial Medal" for Conservative Dentistry. In 1989 he gained his Master of Science (London) in Restorative Dentistry

and in 1991 established the "Cosmetic Dental Clinic" in Remuera, Auckland.

In 1995 Dr Eilenberg established the "Cosmetic Ceramics Laboratory" where he employed master technician Ron Winter, as well as establishing in 1998, New Zealand's first private teaching institution, the "New Zealand Institute of Cosmetic Dentistry" specialising in hands-on courses for general dentists.

He began lecturing internationally on cosmetic dentistry techniques in 1999.

In 2000 Dr Eilenberg was elected President, Diplomat and Life Member of the "World Congress of Microdentistry" based in the USA. In 2001 he was awarded New Zealand's first "Advanced Certificate in Dentistry".

Dr Eilenberg purchased Cerec 3 in 2002. He also purchased E4D in 2009 and became a New Zealand trainer for advanced techniques using ED4 in 2010. He also became a Biolase iLase trainer in the same year.
